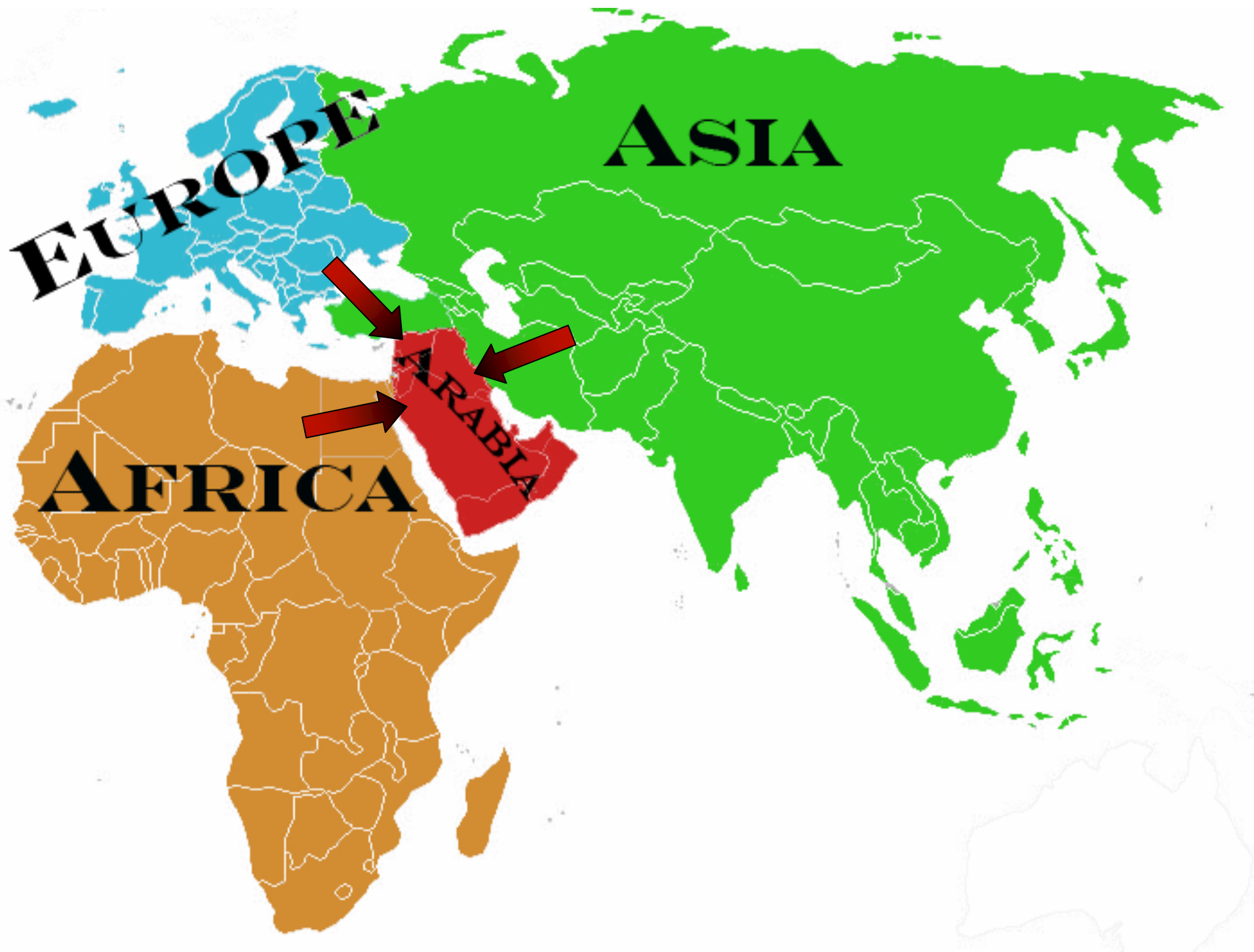
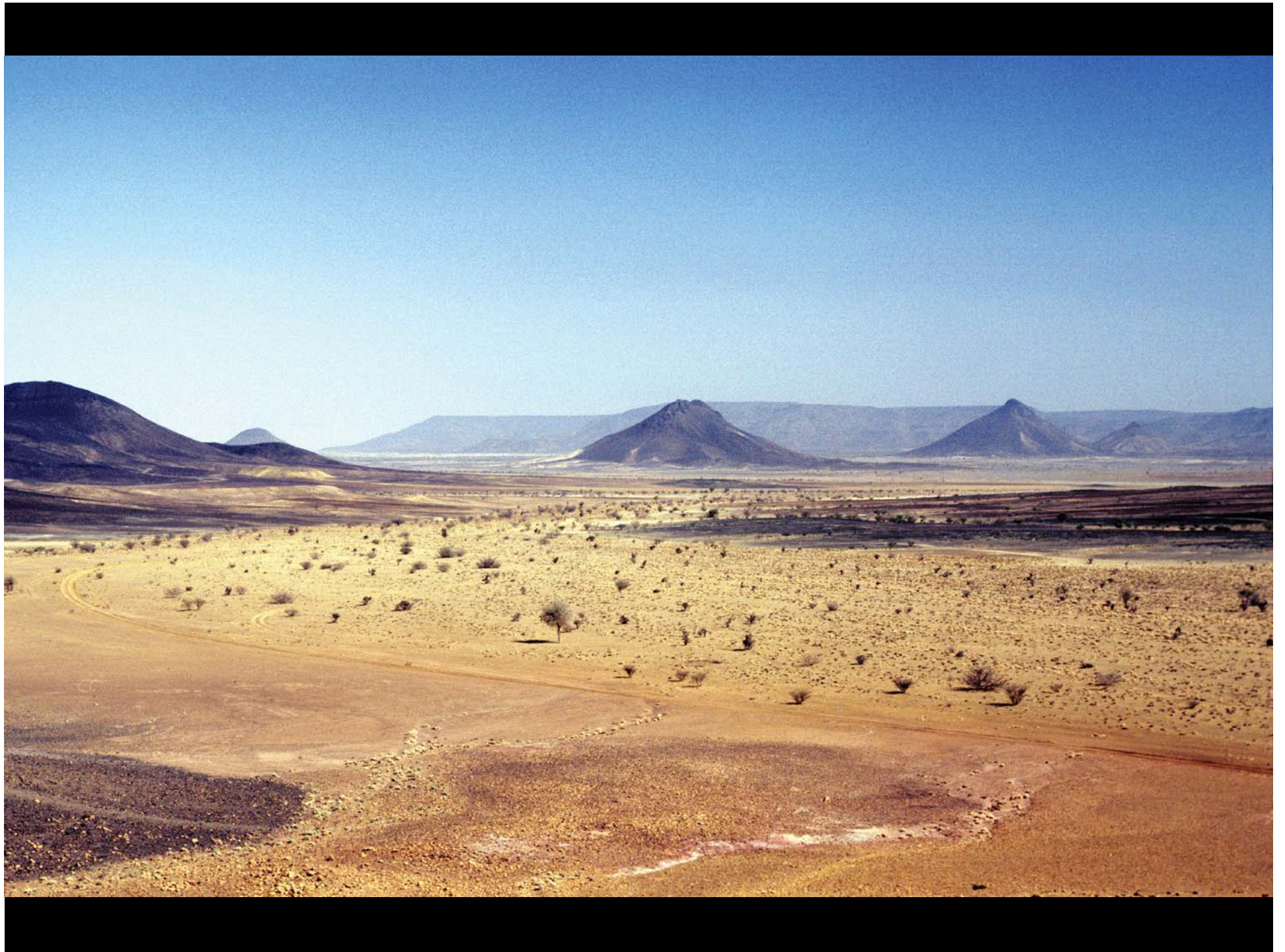








Desert Environment

caravans



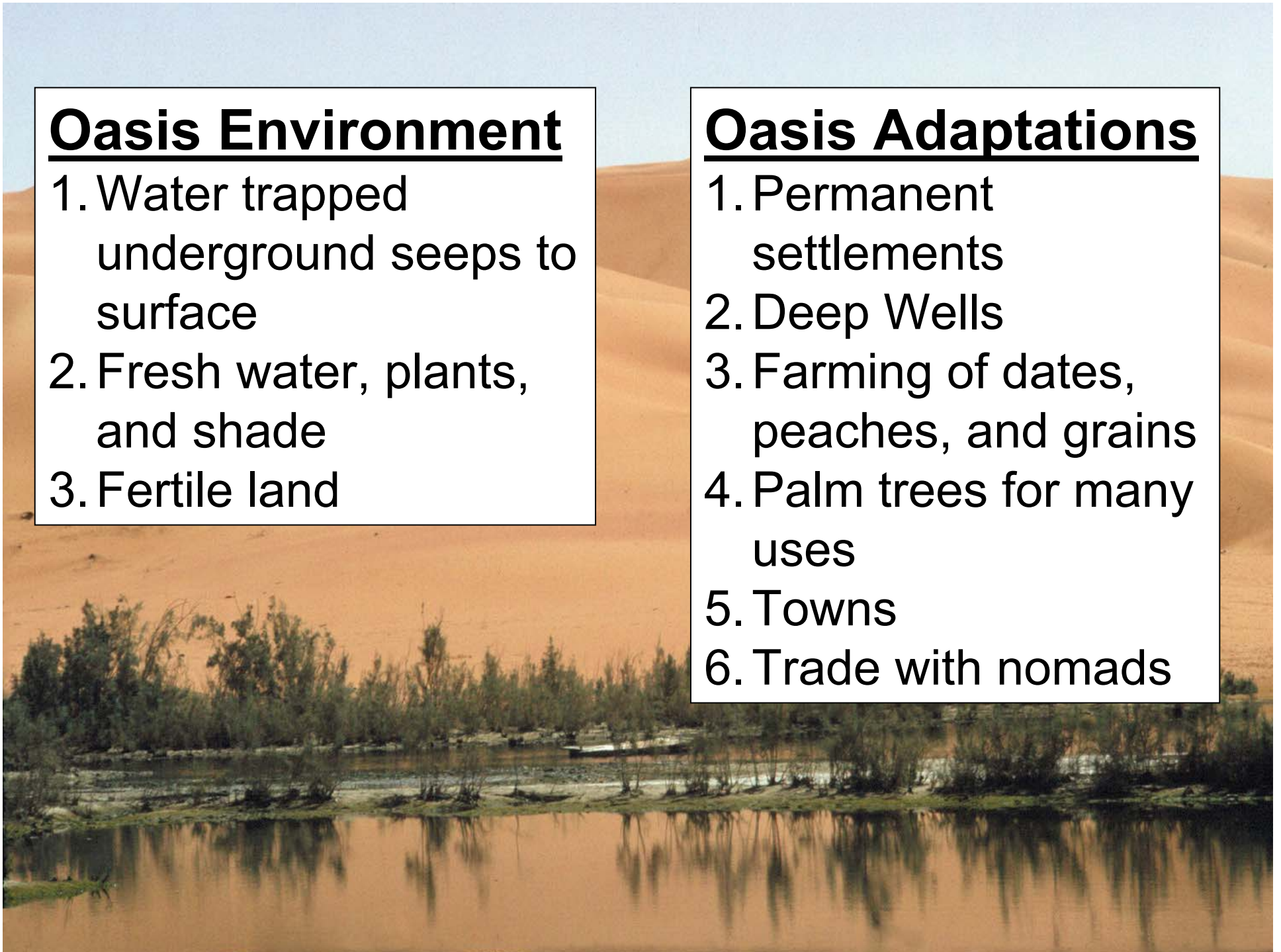


Oasis Environment

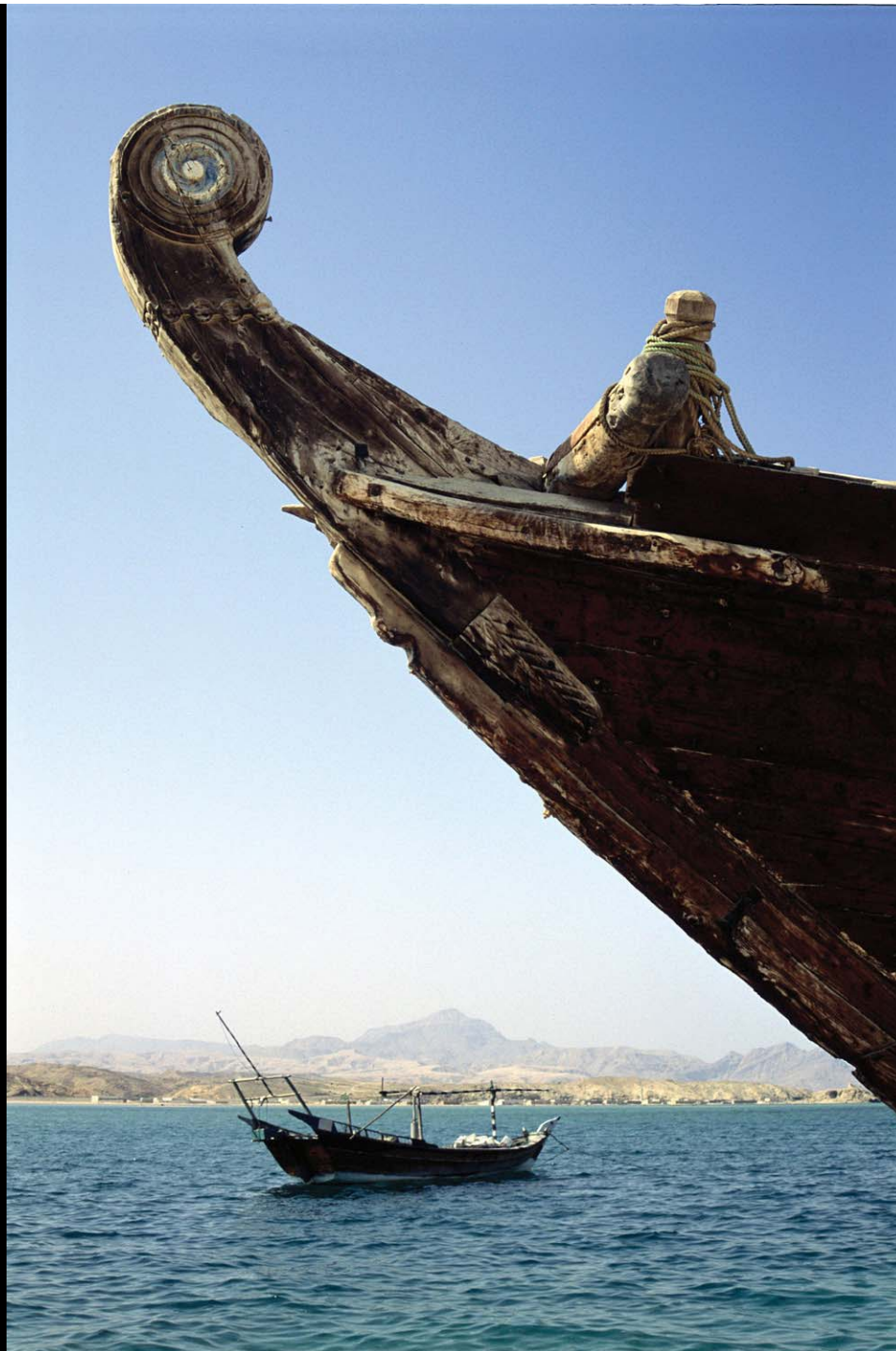
1. Water trapped underground seeps to surface

3. Fertile land

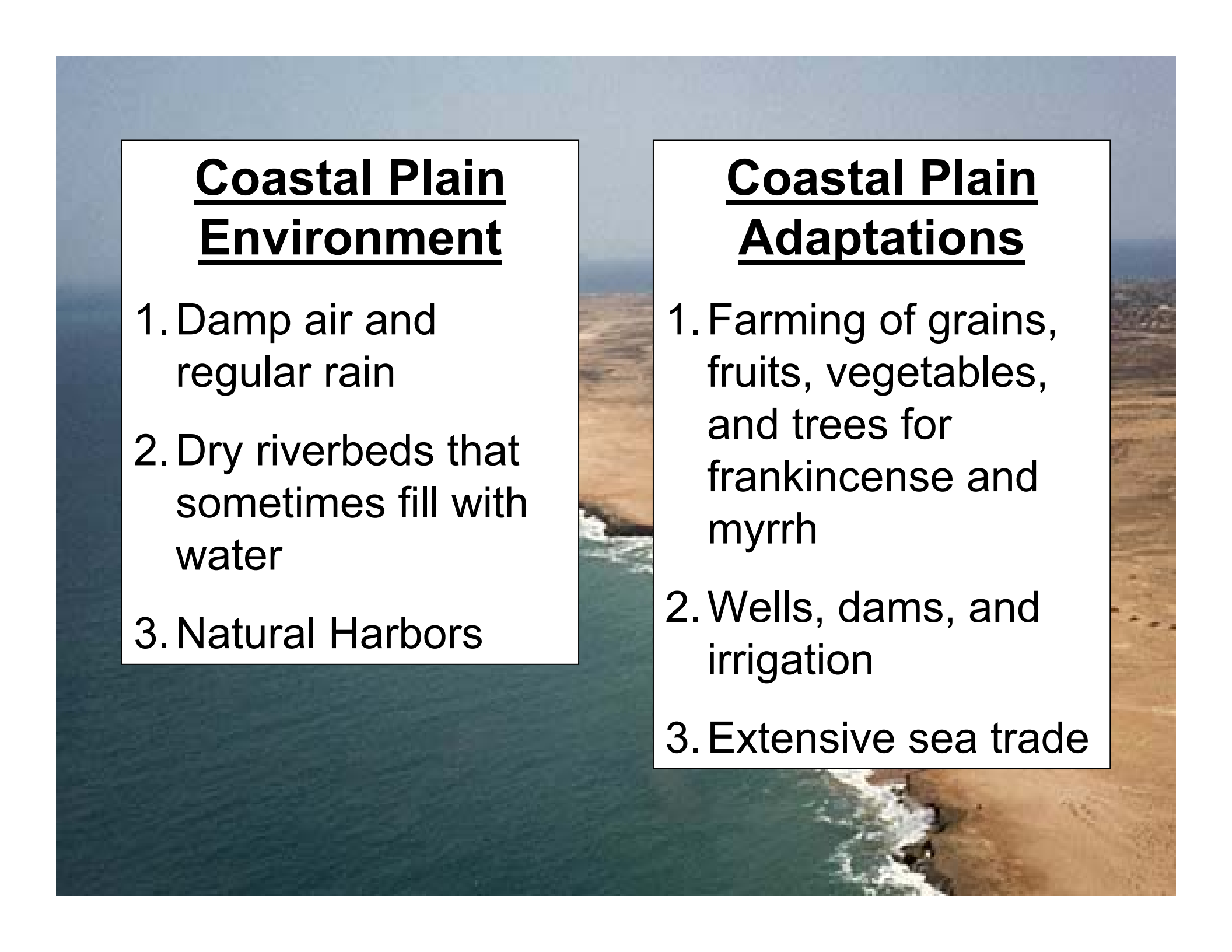
Oasis Adaptations

6. Trade with nomads









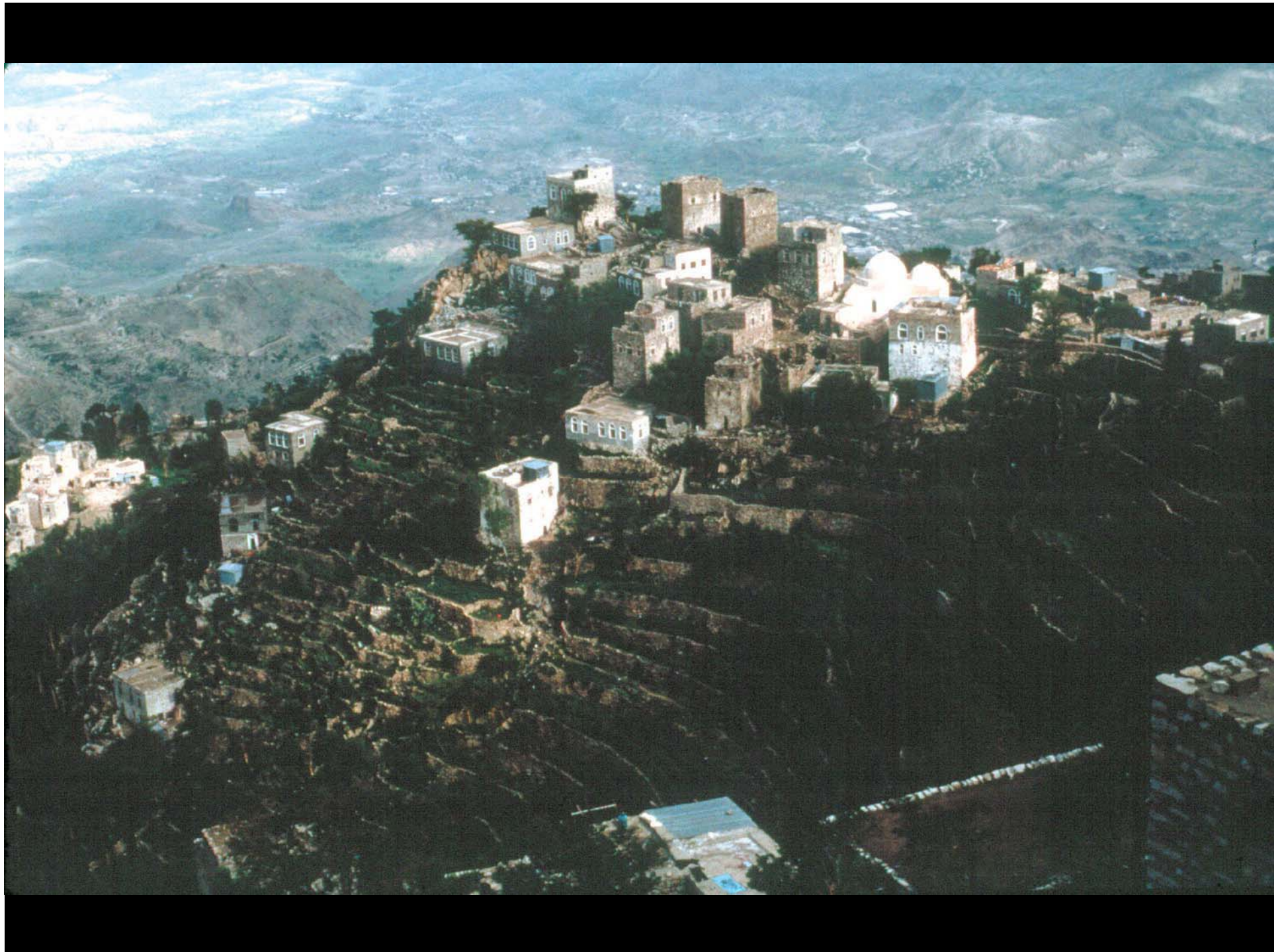
Coastal Plain Environment

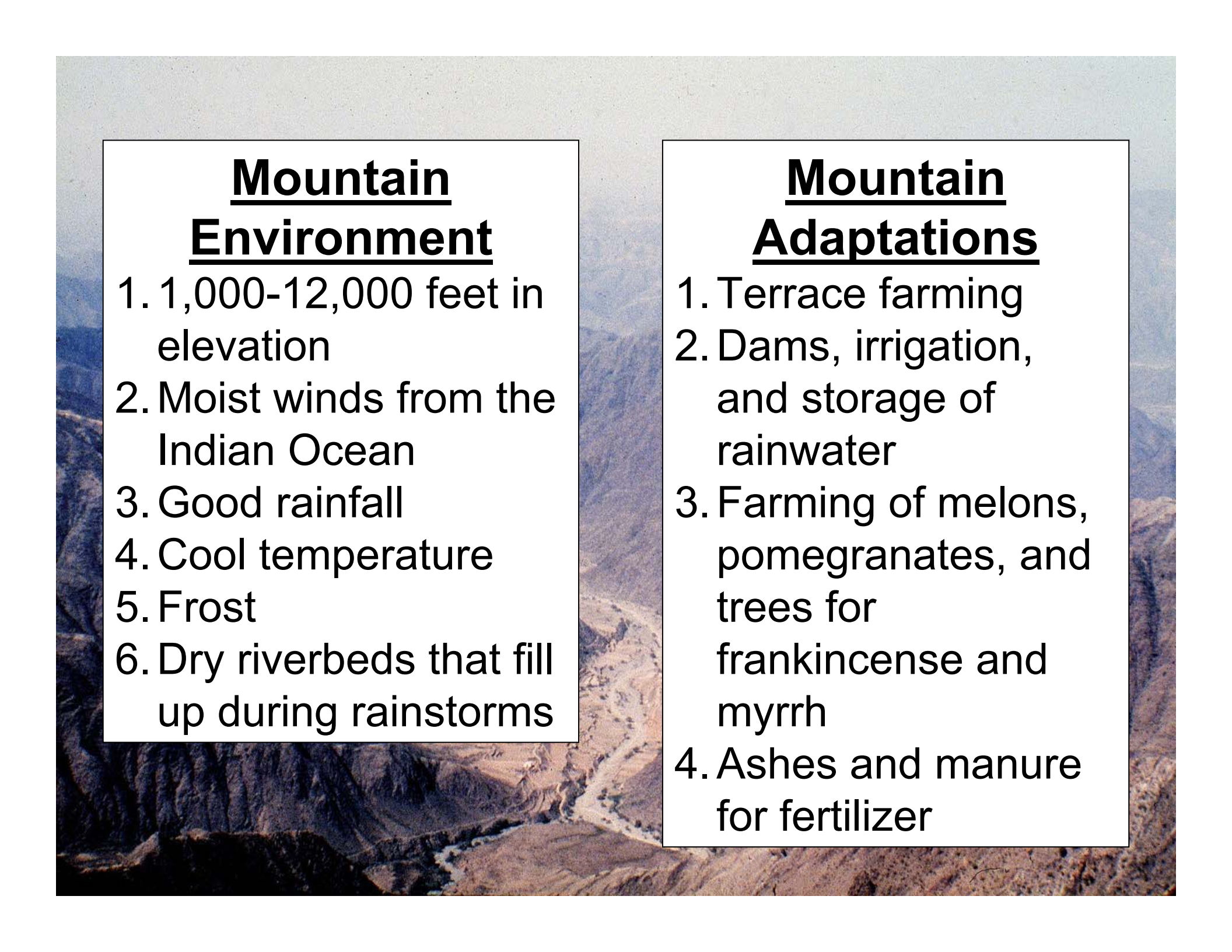
1. Damp air and regular rain
2. Dry riverbeds that sometimes fill with water
3. Natural Harbors

Coastal Plain Adaptations

1. Farming of grains, fruits, vegetables, and trees for frankincense and myrrh
2. Wells, dams, and irrigation
3. Extensive sea trade

Mountain Environment

1. 1,000-12,000 feet in elevation
