Location/Region

- Label Spanish Florida
- Label Atlantic Ocean, Great Lakes, Gulf of Mexico

- Locate products/economy: fish, iron, naval store, pigs, shipbuilding, timber, and whaling, corn, wheat, indigo, tobacco, cotton, rice, furs, etc.
- Cash crops vs. subsistence farming

Things to consider for Place/Physical & Place/Cultural

Examples:

Religions: Religious Tolerance, Quakers, Separatist, Puritans, Baptist

Settlers/Nationalities: English, Scotch Irish, Diversity of European Countries

Type of Government: Charter, Representative Assembly, Royal, Proprietary

Other: Plantations/Slaves, Large Cities, Small Towns, Friends with Native Americans, Founders (William Penn, Duke of York, Fort Colony)
